RE: Trauma Transport Protocol Changes
Pediatric administration of $\mathrm{D}_{5} \mathrm{~W}$
Versed Multi-Dose Vials

Attached is the page change for SOG-430 due to the OPMC Level II Trauma Center certification change as required by the Bureau of EMS.

The $\mathrm{D}_{5} \mathrm{~W}$ that is being distributed is to be used only when $\mathrm{D}_{5} 0$ is not available. Please review the age definitions for neonate, pediatric and adolescent in SOG-430.2801. Also review SOG-430.4011 for symptomatic hypoglycemia levels. Oral Glucose Paste and Glucagon remain acceptable options as appropriately indicated. Below are recommended dosing guidelines for patients under the age of 16 .

## D5W Dosing Guidelines

Neonate $0.25 \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{kg}$ dextrose $=5 \mathrm{ml} / \mathrm{kg}$ D5W
Pediatric $0.25 \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{kg}$ dextrose $=5 \mathrm{ml} / \mathrm{kg} \mathrm{D} 5 \mathrm{~W}$
Adolescent $0.25 \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{kg}$ dextrose $=5 \mathrm{ml} / \mathrm{kg}$ D5W max single dose 250 ml
After verification of the patency of the patient's IV, the appropriate therapeutic amount of $\mathrm{D}_{5} \mathrm{~W}$ is to be drawn up from the $250 \mathrm{ml} \mathrm{D}_{5} \mathrm{~W}$ bag into a 10,30 or 60 ml syringe as appropriate and administered as a slow IVP. BGL rechecks will be performed as outlined in SOG-430.

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Versed (Midazolam) is being distributed in a multi-dose vial with 25 mg in $5 \mathrm{ml} /$ $(5 \mathrm{mg} / \mathrm{ml})$. Per the Medical Director, this is a single patient use only container and is not to be reused. Medication waste is to be documented as outlined in SOG-430.1005.
