

Picture to Left: Retired Battalion Chief Miles Bowers spent the last 13 years of his career at Fire Station # 10 on McDuff Avenue. The Street and Concrete intersection marker adjacent to the station was named after him as seen in the photo. Chief Bowers served as the Director/ Fire Chief twice during his tenure with the Department and was a fire fighter with the JFRD longer than any other member. He was 91 years old at his death and had served on the Department for 57 years.

No Picture: Retired Captain Ted Copeland (Fire Prevention Bureau) was all-state football and basketball at Andrew Jackson High School in 1952. He also captained the basketball team his senior year at University of Florida. Ted is the only local Fire Fighter who is also listed in the Florida Sports Hall of Fame.

Retired Engineer Jimmy "JAMMER" Morgan served 29 years and 2 months with the JFRD. He retired on 9/28/2012 with a host of years assigned to the Mobile Command Van known as "Command Van". Early in 2018, he was contacted and asked to serve on a 5 person committee to help design a new Mobile Command Center. The Apparatus was being built at Frontline Industries in Sarasota. After several trips to Frontline, a multitude of meetings at Tactical Support, the Command Center Vehicle was complete in December 2018. At completion of the final inspection and training on December 17 and 18, it was delivered to Tactical Support on January 9, 2019.

The Command Center is built on a Freightliner Chassis and has 4 slide outs, 9 work stations, 2 conference tables and all the best telecommunications equipment available.
