Update on the Annual Jacksonville Fire Death Benefit Fund meeting held in conjunction with the Union Meeting on January 16, 2020. At the start of the meeting, there was a remembrance for all the JFDB members who passed away in 2019. They were as follows: James Phillips; Richard Hunt; Richard Johnson; Walter Hurlbert (Oldest Living Fireman); Robert J Lewis; and Rebecca R. Viets. A big round of congratulations to those involved in soliciting new members, as of January 31, 2020 we have acquired 121 new members and boast with a total of over 1200 members to date. The annual Election for active duty representatives was held, and Chief Donald Blanton was elected with no opponents, the President. Chief Blanton was unable to attend the meeting due to a 2nd Alarm fire which required his attention since he was on duty.

On December 17, 2019, The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department's Fallen Fire Fighter Memorial Ceremony was held at Fire Station #1, 611 North Liberty Street at 10:00 am. Many attended including the President of the City Council Scott Wilson representing Mayor Lenny Curry, other dignitaries, Director/Fire Chief Keith Powers, Larry Osborne, MOC Nicholas Tison, Dr Percy Golden for the Invocation, JFRD and JSO Honor Guard and of course, the JFRD Pipes and Drums who performed "Amazing Grace". Many thanks to all who contributed their time, their talents, and their attendance to this annual Memorial Service. It is a bittersweet remembrance of those who gave all in the line of duty, and although they are no longer with us in life, we will be with them again in another time. Special thanks and acknowledgements go to the Jacksonville Retired Fire Fighters Association for providing breakfast; Local 122 for hosting the breakfast and providing lunch. Also, many thanks to the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville's Mr. Glen Weiss, Director of the Council's Public Art Program, for their funding the new plaques which describe the History of the Fallen Fire Fighter Memorial as well as the stakeholders who were involved in supporting, designing, and construction of the Memorial.

Jacksonville's Firefighter (Memorial Wall

Throughout the fire service, departments periodically commemorate the fallen firefighters for their service and ultimate sacrifice. This wall befor you has served that purpose in Jacksonville since 1987.

Jacksonville Fire fighter Wayne Doolittle was the driving force behind the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department's Fallen Firefighter Memorial. He relied upon the talents and resources of dozens of local individuals, many of them firefighters, to bring the wall to fruition. The concept emerged in the 1960s when Doolittle's father, Charles, a volunteer firefighter, encouraged his son to one day create a memorial to honor local firefighters who lost their lives in the line of duty.

Two decades later, Doolittle began to fulfill his father's wish when, by chance, he happened upon a massive bronze bell stored in the basement of a downtown, city-owned building. His discovery would be the ideal centerpiece for a memorial given the symbolism of bells in the first service. The 1½ ton creation's original home was in the belfry atop Jacksonville's City Hall, which in 1902 replaced the older building that had been lost to The Great Fire of 1901.

Momentum for the memorial accelerated in 1966 when officials announced plans for a new Fire Station Number 1 at 611 North Liberty Street. This site would serve as an ideal location for the memorial. Among the memorial's supporters were Jacksonville's Honorable Mayor Jake Godbold, Public Safety Director Dale Beerbower and Deputy Director/Fire Chief Miles Bowers. Doolittle soon assembled a team to design, fund and construct the memorial. Lt. Ricky Bowers drafted the plans and District Chief Larry Osborne authored the "Symbolism of the Bell' text.

On June 29, 1987, city officials, citizens and numerous firefighters celebrated new Fire Station 1's opening and the dedication of the Fallen Firefighter Memorial. It remains the site of the department's annual Fallen Firefighter Ceremony.
