Jacksonville Fire Museum Preserving Our Past



Linda Treadwell served as the Jacksonville Fire Rescue Museum Curator for many years. She relied on puppets (pictured above) as props to educate children about Fire Safety. The puppets were named by Linda "Lt. George" who was her husband's (Warren Treadwell) Father. Lt. George Treadwell was assigned to Engine 2 for many years, and eventually was recognized by the JRFA as the oldest living Fire Fighter. The second puppet was "Liddy-Lou" which was her granddaughter's nickname.
