Woody and Larry Norris, was called in on third alarm and were directed to go in to search for victims. I started searching rooms on the second floor and found someone on the floor in the bathroom near the window. I picked her up and carried her to the stairs and handed her over to others. Then discovered two male victims near that same window where they were probably trying to escape ,and carried or dragged them to the stairs and left them with other rescuers. By this time I had to exit the building.

Hobbies: wood working, building furniture and other stuff for family and friends.

Retired: May 7th 1997. After retirement did some consulting in fire and life safety for a large Telephone Co. for about two years.

Enjoys traveling around the USA and has been to all States except Minnesota. Like to do some

gardening and yard work and spend time with family.
